Human Relationships through the Lens of Scripture

We are relational creatures. God created us that way because he is a relational God. But in our lives east of Eden, we struggle to get relationships right, whether it be with God or with one another. This teaching weekend is dedicated to exploring human-to-human relationships and seeking redemption and healing.

Objectives

Our prayerful and hopeful objectives for this conference are to enable participants to:

- 1. Understand God's intention for human relationships.
- 2. Know that there is a Biblical basis for the way we are to conduct our relationships with others both inside and outside the family.
- 3. Learn that many, if not all of us experience some form of challenge to healthy relationships.
- 4. Learn, understand, and apply the role of prayer in the pursuit of healing hurting relationships and sustaining healthy relationships.
- 5. Help others who are experiencing hurting relationships.
- 6. Find healing, as needed, and pursue healthy and fulfilling relationships both inside and outside the family.



Our Relationship with the Trinity: The Trinity as Community

Genesis 1:26-27

Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. And let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over the livestock and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth."



Our Relationship Experience: The Survey Results



Demographics

- 19 Women, 11 Men
- Four survey respondents age 30-50, 26 respondents over age 50




Conclusions: More women than men responded, most were over age 50, and many attended church most of their life or at least for more than 20 years.





Sought help, effective: 17
Sought help, not effective: 4
Want help, not sought: 2

Not a problem: 2
Not applicable to me: 4

Conclusion: Most people sought help and in most of those cases it was effective.

Report of issues experienced in immediate family or known of outside immediate family.








Conclusions: In all cases, except for lack of forgiveness, fewer instances of these issues were reported for the immediate family. It is possible that people are able to assess all of these issues except for lack of forgiveness, when considering people that they know outside of their immediate family. It could be that lack of forgiveness is difficult to discern unless someone is very close to that experience.


Whether inside or outside the immediate family, divorce is the most frequently reported issue, followed by addiction and broken relationships. Conflict, emotional abuse, and marital strife are reported in varying degrees within and outside the immediate family. Incidences of abuse and sexuality problems within the immediate family are reported as low, relative to some of the other issues. Sexuality problems are also the lowest of the items reported for issues known outside the family. This might be explained by the privacy generally associated with sexuality.

When we look at immediate family reporting by gender, we see that men tend to report more abuse, addiction, depression, and divorce; however, the instance of divorce is very close to that reported by women. In contrast, women report slightly more conflict, more lack of forgiveness, and more broken relationships. Women report less abuse, depression, sexuality problems, and slightly less marital strife.

When men and women report on issues outside their immediate family, their perceptions are more similar to each other than for those within the immediate family. But also in this case, women report more abuse, more addiction, less depression, more divorce, more emotional abuse, less lack of forgiveness, more marital strife, slightly more sexuality problems, and slightly more broken relationships. Men report higher levels outside the immediate family for all of the issues except depression and lack of forgiveness.


Report of Action based on Issues Experienced. Issues included: abuse, addiction, conflict, depression, divorce, emotional abuse, lack of forgiveness, marital strife or separation, sexuality problems, broken family relationships.






Conclusion: More females sought help. Very slightly more males reported one or more of the following: (a) help was ineffective, (b) did not seek help when wanted, (c) did not see a problem, and/or (d) the issues were not applicable.

Outcomes of Unhealthy Relationships:



Conclusions: Anger and stress are the most cited outcomes of unhealthy relationships. Next are conflict, depression, and anxiety. Domestic violence was the least cited outcome.



Conclusions: Men cite conflict and domestic violence more than women do, as an outcome of unhealthy relationships. They also cite depression and stress slightly more than women in this case. Anger and anxiety are the only outcomes of unhealthy relationships that women cite more often than men.



Rembrandt's Return of the Prodigal Son


